Rule Updates

- Phoenix Area 2008 8-Hour Ozone NAAQS
 - The NAA includes the Apache Junction portion of Pinal County. Requires RACT VOC SIP rules for:
 - Gasoline storage & Surface Coating operations
 - Rulemaking process complete in 2016; Effective January 1, 2017, EPA has not approved
 - Future rules:
 - □ NSR
 - Repeal HAPS rule
 - Fees
 - NSPS and NESHAP adoption

Pinal County Nonattainment

■ PM-10

- ADEQ Submitted SIP December 2015
- Area Source Controls
 - Agricultural Operations, Earthmoving, Unpaved Roads, Vacant Lots, Unpaved Parking Lots.
- EPA currently reviewing SIP submittal
- In 2017 EPA approved of fugitive dust, construction dust, irrigation district BMP, and open field AgBMP rules
- Challenges ahead with new Hidden Valley PM10;
 Multiple exceedances in 2016 & 2017 (½ stagnation,
 ½ high wind)


Pinal County Nonattainment

- Clean Data Finding 2013
- MAG is now the planning agency for Pinal
- No action required with the CDF

2015 Ozone NAAQS

- ADEQ NAA boundary submittal includes a portion of northern Pinal County
- Final EPA boundary designation Spring 2018

Windblown Dust (Interstate 10)

- Accident hot spot identified near MP-214 (Picacho Peak area)
- Regional Dust Workshop working on issue
- Mitigation sub-group formed to focus on hot spot (ADEQ, ADOT, NRCS, State Land, Pinal County, U of A, public)
- Pilot project for area near MP214
- Stabilization of 55 acres conducted September
 2017 by ADEQ contractor
- Ongoing monitoring to evaluate treatment
